2. Project Report

- (1) The Lingya Campus, with its future development focused on the establishment and growth of the College of Medicine, is currently undergoing overall planning and design following the completion of land allocation procedures. The College of Medicine demonstrates great potential in research capacity and resources and steadily grows in both the number of published papers and the funding granted from research projects. These exceptional performances significantly elevate the academic reputation and enhance the research capacity of the University.
- (2) The University is committed to recruiting outstanding scholars from Taiwan and abroad by offering attractive appointment incentives supported by diverse measures, including the merit pay system, fundraising resources, and subsidies from the Ministry of Education. To further expand the University's network of outstanding international talent, the President will personally lead a faculty recruitment delegation to the USA in September. All units are sincerely invited to recommend promising candidates whose

expertise aligns with the University's development goals, thereby injecting new momentum into its future academic advancement.

- (3) The University was granted the “Holistic Benchmark University Project” by the Ministry of Education last year in recognition of its high achievements in bilingual education. The second phase of the project will be launched next year, and the University will continue to invest manpower, funding, and other resources to secure the project. All colleges and departments please give their full cooperation in jointly promoting and achieving the EMI-related targets. The extent to which these EMI targets are met will also serve as an important basis for future adjustments and allocations of university funding.
- (4) With the increasingly severe decline of birth rates in Taiwan, the number of domestic students is expected to drop continuously. In response to this trend, the University will actively expand international recruitment to stabilize student enrollment. Most of the University's international students are currently in master's and doctoral programs. To increase the enrollment of outstanding international students, all colleges and departments please cooperate and assist in advancing the task of international recruitment.

3.General Discussion

- (1) The Office of International Affairs please review the current scholarship mechanism for international students and propose a feasible adjustment plan to enhance its fairness and flexibility. The goal is to ensure that international students receive stable support during their studies and successfully complete their academic programs.
- (2) A task force will soon be established to facilitate discussions on the merger with National University of Kaohsiung, with briefing sessions

and discussion forums being held when appropriate.
