1. Preamble

Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IITD) is one of the 23 IITs established as Centres of Excellence for training, research, and development in science, engineering, and technology in India. Since its inception, over 60,000 students have graduated from IIT Delhi in various disciplines, including Engineering, Physical Sciences, Management, and Humanities & Social Sciences. Among them, nearly 5,070 received Ph.D. degrees, and over 15,738 graduated with a B.Tech. degree. The remaining alumni obtained Master's degrees in Engineering, Sciences, and Business Administration. These alumni now work as scientists, technologists, business managers, and entrepreneurs. Several have moved beyond their original disciplines into administrative services, active politics, or NGOs, significantly contributing to nation-building and global industrialization. Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IITD) is one of the top public universities in New Delhi, India, ranked #150 in the QS World University Rankings 2025.

National Cheng Kung University (NCKU), located in Tainan, is known for its pragmatic academic climate, strong research capabilities, and internationalized learning environment. NCKU is widely recognized as one of Taiwan's leading universities, ranking 3rd in the country and #215 globally

according to the QS World University Rankings 2025. Looking to the future, NCKU aims to become a world-class research university with a focus on outstanding teaching quality. The university strives to be an institution of global significance, developing high-quality, well-rounded graduates who are highly sought after by the business community. NCKU's motto, "Pursuit of truth through exhaustive reasoning," reflects its down-to-earth academic atmosphere, which fosters the pursuit of knowledge.

National Sun Yat-sen University (NSYSU) is a public, research-intensive university renowned as a think tank and scholars' community located in Kaohsiung, Taiwan. It ranks the fifth comprehensive university in Taiwan and is known for having top maritime and business programs in East Asia. The university often ranks among the world's top 500 universities overall. It is organized into nine colleges and one school. Additionally, it contains a considerable number of research institutes that strive to support science and engineering students and young engineers from foreign institutions who wish to pursue their Bachelor's, Master's, or Ph.D. education in Taiwan.

National Tsing Hua University (NTHU) is a leading comprehensive research university located in Hsinchu, a beautiful city in northern Taiwan, also known as the heart of the country's high-tech industry. Over the last sixty years, NTHU has grown into an institution with 12 colleges offering more than 140 degree programs for international students, covering fields such as science, engineering, nuclear science, life sciences & medicine, electrical engineering & computer science, humanities & social sciences, technology management, arts, education, semiconductors, and more. With a student body of 17,000 and a faculty of 2,000, NTHU provides a stimulating and nurturing environment that supports quality teaching and innovative research. The university's achievements are reflected in publications in the world's leading journals, awarded international patents, and numerous technology transfer cases. These accomplishments have also allowed NTHU to nurture outstanding alumni, including three Nobel Prize winners and a Wolf Prize winner in mathematics, highlighting the university's rich history and excellent academic environment. NTHU is ranked #210 in the QS World University Rankings 2025.

The term partner institutions used in this MOU refers to IITD, NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU.

2. General principles

The partner institutions will endeavor to fulfill the following principles, recognizing that certain aspects may require further refinement and agreement as needed.

In view of the ongoing collaboration between NCKU, NSYSU, NTHU, and IITD, these institutions will further develop cooperation in communications, machine learning, and connected systems by facilitating the exchange of students in the areas of research, learning programs, short exchanges, and the invitation of academics, among others.

Students involved in the mobility program will receive a certificate or equivalent document corresponding to the validated training program completed at the host institution.

Students from either institution who wish to participate in the mobility program will receive assistance from the host institution with administrative registration, as well as access to library and laboratory facilities.

The partner institutions will endeavor to provide logistical support and assistance to student mobility.

Student mobility under this MOU is restricted to exchanges between IITD and one of the three Taiwan universities (NCKU, NSYSU, or NTHU). Student mobility among the three Taiwan universities is not included.

3. Promotion of Training Programs

3.1 IITD commits to informing its students about the existence of the MOU and the training programs offered by the Taiwanese universities (i.e., NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU).

3.2 NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU commit to informing their students about the training programs offered by IITD.

3.3 The training programs offered by NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU aim to be:

- *Undergraduate research internship program (three to six months)*
- *Master's research internship program (six to twelve months)*
- *Ph.D. internship program (six to twenty-four months)*

3.4 The training programs offered by IITD aim to be

- *Undergraduate research internship program (three to six months)*
- *Master's research internship program (six to twelve months)*
- *Ph.D. internship program (six to twenty-four months)*

3.5 The partner institutions agree, when practical, to jointly and periodically review their promotion programs and results, and to identify and implement new action plans to improve their efficiency.

4. Intellectual Property Rights (I.P.R.) and Data Protection

4.1 Consideration will be given to the appropriate protection of any findings from this collaboration, including Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and patents, where appropriate. Any IPR generated from this collaboration will be shared on a pairwise basis between the Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IITD) and each Taiwanese partner institution. Specifically:

- IPR generated between IITD and National Cheng Kung University (NCKU) will be shared between those two institutions.
- IPR generated between IITD and National Sun Yat-sen University (NSYSU) will be shared between those two institutions.
- IPR generated between IITD and National Tsing Hua University (NTHU) will be shared between those two institutions.

The allocation of IPR rights will be proportional to the contribution of each institution, based on the resources, expertise, and labor invested in the generation of such intellectual property. The institutions involved will negotiate in good faith to determine the respective contributions and the corresponding share of IPR.

4.2 Partner institutions commit to respecting the national regulations in force regarding personal data protection.

5. Student Selection Criteria

5.1 "Exchange students" shall refer to students participating in the training programs implemented herein.

5.2 Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the host institution.

5.3 The partner institutions shall endeavor to arrange that exchange students will pay tuition and miscellaneous fees at their home institution, while being waived tuition and miscellaneous fees at the host institution.

5.4 Subject to the existing rules of the host institution, exchange students will be considered students/visitors at the host institution.

5.5 The exchange student's area of research at the host institution will be determined by mutual consultation between their Research Guide at the home institution and their interim Research Guide identified by the host institution.

5.6 It is expected that exchange students will normally have completed their course credit requirements at the home institution.

5.7 IITD and NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU will make efforts to maintain reciprocity in the number of exchange students over the period of the MOU. The partner institutions recognize the importance of the number of exchange students not being contingent upon their areas of research.

6. Special Benefits Associated with the NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU Partnership

IITD will be offered the following benefits:

6.1 Hosting professors will make efforts to provide suitable financial assistance to exchange students to cover living expenses, including accommodation, food, transportation, and medical insurance. However, it is understood that hosting professors may not always have sufficient funds available, and they will do their best within their financial capacity.

6.2 The host institutions will make efforts to provide special support for applications to Bachelor's, Master's, and Ph.D. scholarship programs, for which NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU have preferred access, with no guarantee of success.

NCKU, NSYSU, and NTHU will be offered the following benefits:

6.3 Similarly, hosting professors at IITD will make efforts to provide suitable financial assistance to exchange students to cover living expenses, including accommodation, food, transportation, and medical insurance. These efforts will be made based on the availability of funding, and hosting professors will do their best to support students as circumstances allow.

6.4 The host institution will make efforts to provide special support for applications to Bachelor's, Master's, and Ph.D. scholarship programs for which IITD has preferred access, with no guarantee of success.

7. Management of the Agreement and Administration
